On Thursday, on Jackson Pollock's birthday, the children



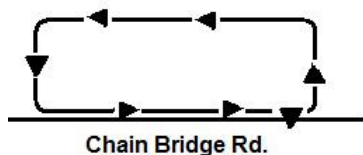
created artworks with marbles and paint.
